At our college, students' progress and development are evaluated using the comprehensive SkillsBuilder framework. This assessment process involves benchmarking students at the outset of the academic year, assigning scores based on their performance in the following vital areas:

**Speaking**: Assessing their ability to communicate effectively and articulate ideas.

**Listening**: Evaluating their attentiveness and capacity to comprehend and engage with information.

**Staying Positive**: Gauging their resilience, optimism, and ability to maintain a positive outlook even in challenging situations.

**Aiming High**: Analysing their ambition, goal-setting, and determination to strive for excellence.

These work placements serve as a bridge to help students comprehend the world of work and equip them with the skills necessary to embark on future internship programmes with confidence and competence.
